Your client has approached you regarding including a bequest to Trinity Families in their will. We have recommended that they talk to you to discuss the various ways of making this bequest and to ensure that correct wording is used so that their intentions are clear.

Trinity Families was established by the Catholic Diocese of Sale and operates the public ancillary fund known as Roman Catholic Diocese of Sale Charitable Fund. It is endorsed by the Australian Tax Office as a deductible gift recipient (DGR 900462833) and our charter allows us to disperse funds to other registered charities with DGR status to run programs benefitting families in the Greater Gippsland area, covered by the municipalities of Casey, Cardinia, Baw Baw, Latrobe, Wellington, East Gippsland, South Gippsland and Bass Coast.

All gifts of \$2 or more are tax deductible.

In preparing a bequest we suggest the following wording:

"I bequeath, free of all debts and all duties and taxes [insert details of the bequest] to Trinity Families (ABN 51 486 581 500), or its successors, for its principal purposes. I declare that the written receipt of an authorised officer of Trinity Families may be accepted by my Executors as a full and complete discharge of this bequest."

We also recommend that the bequest should be unencumbered, particularly if it involves land or share parcels.

Tell us

If your client decides to include Trinity Families in their will, we recommend that they, or you as their legal representatives, speak confidentially to the executive officer to outline the bequest, as it is important we clearly understand the intentions, and whether following death, they would want their generosity publicly acknowledged or to remain private and confidential.
